



Statutory Notice

Cranmere Primary School, The Drive, Esher, Surrey KT10 8DJ

Notice is given in accordance with section 19(1) of the Education and Inspections Act 2006 that Surrey County Council intends to make a prescribed alteration to Cranmere Primary School, The Drive, Esher, Surrey KT10 8DJ

The proposal is to enlarge Cranmere Primary School from two forms of entry (2FE) to three forms of entry (3 FE) with effect from September 2016. A form of entry is normally 30 pupils. The expansion would take place by rebuilding the school on the adjacent land at Grove Farm, owned by Surrey County Council. The relevant planning permission has been obtained.

In September 2016 Cranmere Primary School would admit up to 90 pupils at Reception entry. The school would grow incrementally year on year as each successive Reception intake would be 90 pupils. The school would therefore reach its new capacity of 3 FE throughout all year groups by September 2022. The new school would also have a 26 place nursery.

The original capacity of Cranmere Primary School was 210 (1 FE) but there are approximately 331 pupils currently on roll due to added accommodation, enabling the school to accept more pupils as a temporary measure. This means that there are 2 FE in 5 of the 7 year groups. The proposed future capacity of the new Cranmere Primary School will be 630 plus nursery.

The admission arrangements will not be changed. The transport arrangements for the school will be in accordance with Surrey County Council's current school transport policy.

Surrey County Council has complied with all applicable statutory requirements to consult in connection with this proposal. At the conclusion of the Notice period, if permission is granted by The Surrey Cabinet Member for Schools and Learning, Surrey County Council will implement the proposal.
