Sunbury on Thames

The proposal

The governing body of Hawkedale Infants – A Foundation School, in conjunction with Surrey County Council, is proposing:

- To make a significant change to the school by expanding from a single form of entry (1FE) infant school to a single form of entry (1FE) all through primary school (Reception – Year 6). This would allow for a roll of 210 pupils.
- That the change would come into effect from September 2017.
- To remodel the school on its present site to provide additional classrooms to accommodate the gradual increase of pupils, whilst maximizing external play space.

The current position at Hawkedale Infants' School

1. The main building of the school was built in the 1970s as a first school. Since the development of the site as an infant school, the caretaker's house has been remodeled and is now currently used as a day nursery which is operated by a third party provider.
2. The school, as it stands, has permanent accommodation for up to 90 pupils. It is situated in a residential area in Sunbury on Thames, adjacent to fields enclosing horses and ponies and London Irish RFC's training ground. The Bishop Wand CofE Secondary School is situated to the rear of the school across fields. The school has limited parking and vehicular access. A small playground area and wooded and grassed areas are in the grounds.
3. The school is located at the end of Stratton Road, where the road turns into Sunmead Road.
4. The school reception is accessed via a footpath between the school boundary and the neighbouring field. Entry is gained onto the site by a security gate, which is unlocked remotely by school office staff. Pupils, parents, staff and visitors then gain access to the school by a short path to the main door. The school office and headteacher's office are off the reception area. Teaching staff entering the premises by car, as well as children and parents accessing the third party nursery, do so through the main gate. The nursery provides useful revenue for the school.
5. Children are accommodated in three classrooms, and there is an assembly hall and kitchen that prepares and cooks school meals on site.
6. Children currently leave the school at the end of Year 2, and parents make separate admissions for Year 3 places at Springfield Primary School and Chennestone Primary School – which admit new pupils in Key Stage 2 (KS2). Some parents choose to apply for a KS2 place at St Nicholas CofE Primary School in Shepperton, which may be offered subject to vacant places being available.
7. The school is popular and was rated 'Good' in its last Ofsted inspection in October 2012.

8. The headteacher and governing body are willing to expand the school to become an all through primary school.

What is being proposed

9. This proposal provides Surrey County Council and the governing body of Hawkedale Infants' School with the opportunity to remodel the accommodation and provide the community with an all through primary school.
10. The site covers 0.6 hectares and this is considered sufficient to support a 1FE all through primary school based on Department for Education (DfE) guidelines.
11. It is proposed that four new classrooms will be based near the existing footprint of the school and will not substantially impact on the playground area. The design of the new buildings will be such that there is minimal impact on the outdoor environment. As soon as the governing body has approved an outline design for the new buildings, the plans will be made available to parents, residents and other interested parties for consultation. Capital costs would be met by Surrey County Council.
12. The school would start to provide Key Stage 2 places from September 2017, when the cohort from the September 2014 Reception intake would move from Year 2 to Year 3. The school would be operating as a full 1FE all through primary school from September 2020 onwards, as shown below:

Why are we making these proposals?

13. Hawkedale Infants is a foundation school, and the head teacher and governing body would like to expand the school to provide an all through primary school. The school was rated 'Good' in its last Ofsted, and its leadership is ambitious for the school's future. Expanding the school to provide all through primary education would have benefits for the local community, by providing opportunities for siblings in a family to attend the same school. It would also ease the transition made by children when transferring from Key Stage 1 to Key Stage 2, as pupils could remain at Hawkedale instead of transferring to another school for their junior education.
14. There is a need for additional primary school places in Sunbury on Thames (see forecast information below). Currently forecasts and previous

experience indicate that the need is for 7FE (or 210 places per year group) at Key Stages One and Two in this planning area. Currently 6.3 FE is provided as shown in the table below:

15. The additional one form of entry (1FE) that is needed will be provided partially at Hawkedale (1FE at Key Stage 2) and partially at Springfield Primary School (1FE at Reception and Key Stage 1), as highlighted in the table below:

16. The government expects local authorities to expand successful and popular schools wherever possible and this proposal meets that expectation. In conjunction with this proposal, Surrey County Council is also working with Springfield Primary School (an academy in the GLF Schools trust), to provide an additional form of entry at Key Stage 1.

17. By expanding Springfield Primary School by one form of entry at Key Stage 1, and Hawkedale Infants by one form of entry at Key Stage 2, the Sunbury primary planning area would be provided with the additional one form of entry needed.

18. All of the schools in the Sunbury planning area have been consulted on this before the proposal to expand Hawkedale Infants and Springfield Primary was developed.

19. It is necessary for both Hawkedale Infants and Springfield Primary to expand at the same time, to provide the additional form of entry needed in the

Sunbury planning area.

The need for additional places in Sunbury on Thames

20. Forecasts and historical data show that school rolls have risen consistently in Spelthorne Borough over the last eight years, because the borough birth rate has risen by 26% since 2002. This is reflected in the numbers of children requiring school places and additional demand is due to housing development and inward migration into the borough. Sunbury primary pupil numbers have reflected this borough trend, rising from around 923 places per year in 2012 to 1,404 places in 2017. That equates to two more classes per year.
21. The Sunbury planning area is served by the five schools named above. These schools have been frequently oversubscribed and Springfield Primary currently has two temporary 'bulge' classes (in Year 2 and Reception) to meet local need. It is necessary to address the shortage of places on a permanent basis, providing places in the areas where they are needed, which is this proposal's objective.
22. Projections for this planning area are given in the table below. The later projection figures should however be treated with some caution as these are based on statistical trends rather than on actual births. Figures will be adjusted annually to reflect demographic changes.
