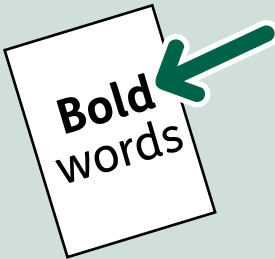

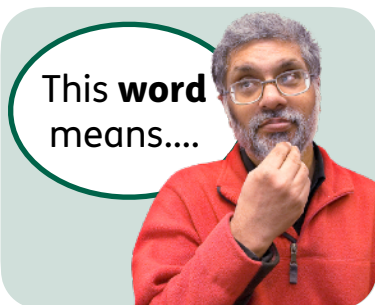
This is an Easy Read version of some information. It may not include all of the information but it will tell you about the important parts.

Surrey County Council provides support with travel to school and college for **eligible** children and young people in Surrey.

Eligible means someone is allowed to get or do something.



This includes things like free bus and train passes, fuel money for parents and carers, and council vehicles to take children on their journey.



This booklet will tell you about some changes we want to make to our travel support for 16 to 25 year olds.



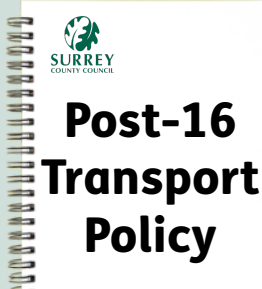

Travel support



We have some rules about our travel support for 16 to 25 year olds.



The rules are set out in a document called the **Post-16 Transport Policy**.



The **policy** says:

- How we decide who can get support.



- The different types of support that are available.



The changes we want to make are included in the separate Easy Read version of the policy.

We will follow the law about keeping your answers safe and private.



In some of the questions we talk about young people with **SEND** and **additional needs**.



SEND stands for **S**pecial **E**ducational **N**eeds and **D**isabilities. Children and young people with SEND are aged 0 to 25 and need some extra support to learn and grow.



In Surrey, we say **additional needs** instead of SEND. But we use both terms in some of the questions.

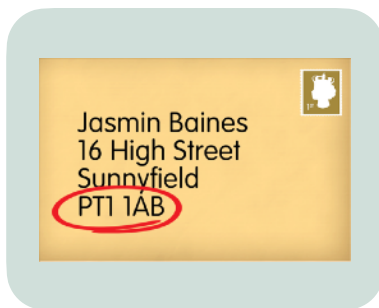

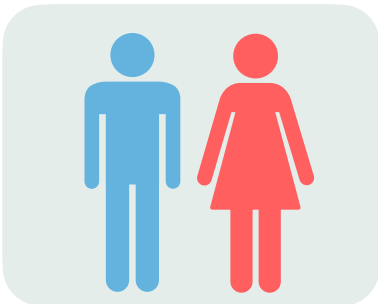
