The Governing Body of The Priory Church of England (VA) School in Dorking, in partnership with Surrey County Council and the Diocese of Guildford, is proposing to close its sixth form provision from 1st September 2022. Current National Curriculum Year 12 students would complete their education at The Priory and the proposed closure would have no impact on current National Curriculum Year 13 students.

Alteration description

4. A description of the proposed alteration and, in the case of special school proposals, a description of the current special needs provision.

The Priory Church of England (Voluntary Aided) School is a secondary school with six forms of entry and a Published Admission Number (PAN) of 180 for pupils age 11-16 years. In addition, the school has a sixth form provision with a capacity of 200 places across National Curriculum Years 12 to 13 for pupils aged 16-18 years.

The Governing Body of The Priory Church of England (VA) School in Dorking, in partnership with Surrey County Council and the Diocese of Guildford, is proposing to close its sixth form provision from September 2022. The proposal will make a prescribed alteration to the age range of the school from 11-18 years, to 11-16 years.

School capacity

The Priory CE (Aided) School currently offers up to 200 places in Years 12 and 13.

The proposed capacity after the alteration: From 1 September 2022, it is proposed that the school will cease to offer any places in the sixth form (Years 12 and 13). The pupils expected to attend in Year 13 from September 2021 will leave at the end of the academic year 2021/22.

The Priory Church of England (VA) School has a capacity of 200 places for sixth form provision and as of the January 2021 census, only had 45 pupils on roll. It is not sustainable to maintain a provision which is undersubscribed and underutilised and therefore the Governing Body of the school, in conjunction with Surrey County Council and the Diocese of Guildford are proposing that the provision be removed from September 2022.

The Priory Church of England (VA) School already has an established relationship with local feeder colleges including Reigate, East Surrey and The College of Richard Collyer (Collyers) which are a popular choice for National Curriculum Year 11 pupils. There are four other secondary schools with a post-16 provision, one in Dorking (0.94 miles), two in Leatherhead (5 miles) and one in Effingham (3.9 miles).

As part of the existing careers provision, all National Curriculum Year 11 students are provided with the information and support required to make a positive transition from senior school to the next stage in their education, whether that is sixth form, vocational training or apprenticeships. Every National Curriculum Year 11 student will continue to be supported in securing the appropriate pathway that is right for them, and which closely matches their ambitions and aspirations.
