SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL - BOROUGH OF GUILDFORD

**PROPOSED REDUCTION OF THE EXISTING 50 MPH TO A 40 MPH SPEED LIMIT ON
A LENGTH OF THE A246 EPSOM ROAD IN THE EAST HORSLEY AND WEST
HORSLEY AREAS, IMPOSITION OF A 30 MPH SPEED LIMIT ON MANOR GARDENS
(D637) AT EFFINGHAM AND A 50 MPH SPEED LIMIT ON A LENGTH OF THE A246
EPSOM ROAD AT EAST CLANDON AND THE RE-IMPOSITION OF CERTAIN
EXISTING 50, 40 AND 30 MPH SPEED LIMITS ON CERTAIN LENGTHS OF THE A246
GUILDFORD ROAD/EPSOM ROAD IN THE EFFINGHAM, EAST HORSLEY, WEST
HORSLEY AND EAST CLANDON AREAS**

1. SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL PROPOSE TO MAKE The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in the Parishes of East Clandon West Horsley East Horsley and Effingham in the Borough of Guildford) (40 mph Speed Limit and 30 mph Speed Limit and Revocation and Amendment) Order 202- under Sections 81, 82, 83 and 84 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act") (as amended), the purpose and effect of which will be to -

- (a) reduce the existing maximum speed limit of 50 mph imposed by The Surrey County Council Various Roads in the Parishes of East Horsley Effingham Normandy and Worplesdon (Restricted Roads and 40/50 mph Speed Limits) (No. 2) Order 2001 ("the Order of 2001"), The Surrey County Council Crocknorth Road (C44) Green Dene (C44/D259) and Guildford Road (A246) East Horsley and Effingham in the Borough of Guildford (Revocation of 40 mph Speed Limit and 50 mph Speed Limit and Imposition of 40 mph Speed Limit and 30 mph Speed Limit) Order 2013 ("the Order of 2013") and The Surrey County Council Epsom Road (A246) West Horsley in the Borough of Guildford (40 mph Speed Limit and 50 mph Speed Limit) (Amendment and Revocation) Order 2019 ("the Order of 2019") to a maximum speed limit of 40 mph on that length of Epsom Road (A246) at East Horsley and West Horsley which extends from a point 28 metres east of the westernmost end of the elongated grassed island site situated at, or adjacent to, the junction of Epsom Road (A246), the unnamed service road leading to and from St Mary's Church, West Horsley and the unnamed service road leading to and from the car park to the above-mentioned Church and the area of land known as "Sheepleas" and also to Public Bridleway No. 100 West Horsley westwards and then south-westwards to a point 175 metres south-west-of the junction of Epsom Road (A246) with the circulatory carriageway comprised in the roundabout known locally as the "Window Box Roundabout" and/or

the “Bell and Colvill Roundabout” (situated at the junction of Epsom Road (A246), The Street (C40) and Shere Road (D258) (also known as “Chalk Road”);

- (b) impose a maximum speed limit of 50 mph on that length of Epsom Road (A246) at East Clandon which extends from a point 677 metres south-west of the junction of Epsom Road (A246) with the circulatory carriageway comprised in the roundabout known locally as the “Window Box Roundabout” and/or the “Bell and Colvill Roundabout” south-westwards to a point 776 metres south-west of the junction of Epsom Road (A246) with the circulatory carriageway comprised in the aforesaid “Window Box Roundabout” and/or the “Bell and Colvill Roundabout”, a distance of 99 metres;
- (c) impose a maximum speed limit of 30 mph on the entire length of Manor Gardens (D637) at Effingham, including the whole of the vehicular turning area situated at the south-western end of that road;
- (d) re-impose the existing maximum speed limit of 30 mph imposed originally by the Order of 2013 on the lengths of roads described in the Schedule to this Notice;
- (e) re-impose the existing maximum speed limit of 40 mph on that length of Guildford Road and Epsom Road (A246) at Effingham, East Horsley and West Horsley imposed originally by the Order of 2001, the Order of 2013 and the Order of 2019 which extends from a point 10 metres south-west of the south-western property boundary line of Dolphin House, Guildford Road, Effingham in a generally south-easterly direction to a point 28 metres east of the westernmost end of the elongated grassed island site situated at, or adjacent to, the junction of Epsom Road (A246), the unnamed service road leading to and from St Mary’s Church, West Horsley and the unnamed service road leading to and from the car park to the above-mentioned Church and the area of land known as “Sheepleas” and also to Public Bridleway No. 100 West Horsley and on that length of Guildford Road (A246) at Effingham which extends from a point 10 metres east of the eastern kerb-line of Manorhouse Lane (D267) (at the lamp column lying on the eastern side of that junction and opposite No. 2 Woodlands Road) eastwards to the boundary between the Borough of Guildford (Parish of Effingham) and the District of Mole Valley (at a point approximately 35 metres east of the eastern kerb-line of Manorhouse Lane) imposed originally by the Order of 2013;
- (f) re-impose the existing maximum speed limit of 50 mph on that length of Epsom Road (A246) at West Horsley and East Clandon imposed originally by The Surrey County Council Various Roads in the Parish of West Horsley (40 mph Speed Limit and 50 mph Speed Limit) Order 2003 (“the Order of 2003”) which extends from a point 175

metres south-west-of the junction of Epsom Road (A246) with the circulatory carriageway comprised in the roundabout known locally as the “Window Box Roundabout” and/or the “Bell and Colvill Roundabout” south-westwards to a point 677 metres south-west of the junction of Epsom Road (A246) with the circulatory carriageway comprised in the aforesaid “Window Box Roundabout” and/or the “Bell and Colvill Roundabout”.

2. A copy of the proposed Speed Limit Order, together with two Plans showing the roads and lengths of roads to which that Order relates, a Statement of the County Council's reasons for proposing to make the Speed Limit Order, The London Traffic (40 m.p.h. Speed Limit) (No. 22) Order 1964 (S.I. 1964/1038), the Order of 2001, the Order of 2003, The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in East Clandon) (30 mph Speed Limit 40 mph Speed Limit and 50 mph Speed Limit) Order 2004, The Surrey County Council Epsom Road (A25/A246) West Clandon (50 mph Speed Limit) Order 2006, the Order of 2013, the Order of 2019, The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in the Parishes of Tongham Wanborough West Horsley and Wisley in the Borough of Guildford) (Revocation of 40 mph Speed Limit and 50 mph Speed Limit and Imposition of 40 mph Speed Limit and 30 mph Speed Limit) Order 2015 (and the plans which accompany all of those sealed Orders, except for the above-mentioned Orders of 1964 and 2001) and a Statement of the County Council's Guidelines for the Acceptance of Objections to Traffic Regulation Orders may be inspected, free of charge -

- (d) at Horsley Library, Station Parade, Ockham Road South, East Horsley on Mondays between 2 p.m. and 5 p.m., on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays between 10 a.m. and 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. and 5 p.m. and on Saturdays between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.; or
- (e) at Leatherhead Library, The Mansion, Church Street, Leatherhead between 9.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Tuesdays to Saturdays inclusive.

3. If you wish to object or make any other representation to any of the proposed reduction of existing and/or imposition of new and/or re-imposition of existing speed limits as contained in the proposed Speed Limit Order and as described above in paragraph 1 of this Notice, you must send the grounds for your objection or representation (including any in support) -

SCHEDULE

That length of Guildford Road (A246), Effingham which extends from a point 10 metres south-west of the south-western property boundary line of "Dolphin House", Guildford Road north-eastwards to a point 12 metres south-west of the south-western side of the entrance to/exit from the Effingham Golf Club car park, a distance of approximately 283 metres.

The entire length of the service road known as "Guildford Road" and numbered as the "D637" fronting the properties known as "Dolphin House", "The Tythe Barn" and "Fairway", Guildford Road, Effingham, a distance of approximately 138 metres.

The entire length of the service road known as "Guildford Road" and numbered as the "D637" fronting the properties known as "Crosslands", "No. 1 The Crossroads" and "The Lodge", Guildford Road, Effingham and the property presently occupied by The Effingham Garage, Guildford Road, Effingham.
