Surrey County Council Proposed Traffic Calming Measures in East Hill (D3731) Woking

SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL in exercise of their powers under Section 90(A) to (I) of the Highways Act 1980 propose to introduce a series of traffic calming features in East Hill (D3731) Woking. The types of physical measures and the locations are as follows –

- (a) 1 flat-topped road table, the centre line of which will be situated at a point 42.5m east of the junction of Mayhurst Avenue;
- (b) A pair of flat-topped road cushions, the centre line of which will be situated at a point 54m east of the junction of Westerfolds Road;
- (c) 1 flat-topped road table, the centre line of which will be 34.5m east of the junction of East Gardens;
- (d) A pair of flat-topped road cushions, the centre line of which will be 17.5m west of the junction of Linkway;
- (e) 1 flat-topped road table, the centre line of which will be 62m east of the junction of Linkway.

For sub-paragraphs (a), (c) and (e) above: The road table will extend across the full width of the carriageway and will be 75mm in height, with 1.5m long ramps at a gradient of 1:20. The flat-topped section of the road table will be 4m in length.

For sub-paragraphs (b) and (d) above: Each cushion will be 1.6m wide, 75mm in height and 3.5m in length. The main ramp gradient will be 1 in 8 and the side ramp gradient will be 1 in 4.
