## Surrey County Council - Borough of Guildford Proposed Reduction of the Existing 40 Mph Speed Limit on the Entire Length of Foreman Road (C18) and a Length of White Lane (C18) at Ash to a 30 mph Speed Limit

- Surrey County Council ("The County Council") Propose to make The Surrey County Council (Foreman Road (C18) and White Lane (C18) Ash in the Parishes of Ash Tongham and Wanborough in the Borough of Guildford) (Revocation of 40 mph Speed Limit and Imposition of 30 mph Speed Limit and Amendment) Order 202- under Sections 81, 82, 83 and 84 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act"), (as amended) and of all other enabling powers, the purpose and effect of which will be to –
  - (a) revoke the existing 40 mph maximum speed limit imposed by The Surrey County Council Various Roads in the Parishes of Ash and Tongham (40/50 mph Speed Limits) Order 2001 ("the Order of 2001") and The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in the Parishes of Tongham Wanborough West Horsley and Wisley in the Borough of Guildford) (Revocation of 40 mph Speed Limit and 50 mph Speed Limit and Imposition of 40 mph Speed Limit and 30 mph Speed Limit) Order 2015 ("the Order of 2015") on the entire length of Foreman Road (C18), Ash and that length of White Lane (C18), Ash which extends from its junction with Foreman Road (C18) and Ash Green Lane southwards to a point 77 metres south of a point opposite the northern side of the unnamed access road leading to and from the property currently known as "Warren Farm", White Lane a distance of approximately 921 metres –

(**Note** – The entire length of Foreman Road (C18) and that length of White Lane (C18) at Ash which extends from its junction with Foreman Road and Ash Green Lane southwards to the lamp column situated immediately to the south of the unnamed access road leading to and from the property currently known as "Warren Farm", White Lane would then become subject to a 30 mile per hour speed limit by virtue of the street lighting system currently provided on those lengths of roads);

- (b) impose a 30 mile per hour speed limit on that length of White Lane (C18), Ash which extends from the lamp column situated immediately to the south of the unnamed access road leading to and from the property currently known as "Warren Farm" White Lane southwards to a point 77 metres south of a point opposite the northern side of the afore-mentioned unnamed access road, a distance of approximately 73 metres, as no system of street lighting is provided on this length of White Lane;
- (c) carry out a drafting amendment to the Order of 2015 to take account of the proposed changes to the current 40 mph speed limit in White Lane (C18), Ash referred to in sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) above.
- A copy of the proposed Speed Limit Order, together with a plan showing the lengths of roads to which that Order relates, the Order of 2001, the Order of 2015 (and the plans that accompany the Order of 2015), a Statement of the County Council's reasons for proposing to make the Speed Limit Order and a Statement of the County Council's Guidelines for the Acceptance of Objections to Traffic Regulation Orders may be inspected, free of charge –
