Proposed Raised Zebra Crossing and Removal of a Speed Cushion
on Frenches Road (C224) Redhill

Notice is hereby given that Surrey County Council, in exercise of their powers under Section 23 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, Section 90(A) to (I) inclusive of the Highways Act 1980, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Section 23(2)(A) of the said Act of 1984, propose to introduce a raised Zebra Crossing on Frenches Road (C224) Redhill, the centre line of which will be located 15.5m west of its junction with Kingfisher Drive and at the centre of a road table. The flat-topped road table will extend across the full width of the carriageway and will be 7.5m in length, 2.4m in width between the studs, 115mm in height and with 1.5m long ramp at a gradient of 1:13. The existing speed cushions on the same length of Frenches Road will be removed.
