SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL - DISTRICT OF MOLE VALLEY
PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE EXISTING PEDESTRIANISATION
SCHEME IN CERTAIN LENGTHS OF CHURCH STREET (D2885) AND HIGH
STREET (D2885) LEATHERHEAD

1. SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL (“THE COUNTY COUNCIL”) propose to make -
 - (a) The Surrey County Council (Church Street (D2885) and High Street (D2885) Leatherhead) (Prohibition of Traffic and One-Way Traffic) Order 2003 (Amendment No. 4) Order 202- under Sections 1(1) and 2(1) to (3) of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the 1984 Act”); and
 - (b) The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in Mole Valley) (Amendment of Waiting Loading and Unloading Prohibition and On-Street Parking Places Orders) (Amendment No.) Order 202- under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 4, 32, 35, 36, 45, 46, 49, 51 and 53 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act,
the purpose and effect of which would be to introduce certain changes to the existing pedestrianisation scheme in Church Street and High Street, Leatherhead.
2. THE purpose and effect of the proposed Order referred to in sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph 1 above would be -
 - (a) to alter the hours of operation of the existing pedestrianisation scheme in certain parts of Church Street (D2885) and High Street (D2885), Leatherhead (which applies to all vehicles) so that they will apply between 10.00 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on any day of the week;
 - (b) as a result, to provide that the time by which any vehicle which has entered Church Street (D2885) and/or High Street (D2885), Leatherhead before 10.00 a.m. on any day of the week must leave those roads by no later than 10.15 a.m. on the same morning of the same day by passing through the junction of High Street (D2885) with the unnamed access road leading to and from The Leatherhead Institute;
 - (c) to provide that the following additional exemptions would apply to the existing pedestrianisation scheme referred to in sub-paragraph (a) above -
 - (i) to any vehicle being used in connection with the Leatherhead Street Market held on every Thursday and Saturday between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. inclusive (any such day not being Christmas Day, Boxing Day or New Year’s Day), provided that such vehicles must enter Leatherhead High Street (D2885) from Church Street (D2885) by following the existing one-way system in that road and must leave the High Street (D2885) Leatherhead by following

the direction given in sub-paragraph (b) above so as to comply with the existing one-way system, which would continue to remain in force without any change whatsoever;

- (ii) to any person riding a pedal cycle, provided that that person follows the existing one-way system in Church Street (D2885) and High Street (D2885), Leatherhead (NOTE- Any pedal cyclist must dismount and push their pedal cycle along the length of High Street (D2885), Leatherhead described in paragraph 3 below).
3. The existing hours of operation (at any time of the day or night throughout the week) of the existing pedestrianisation scheme in that part of High Street (D2885) Leatherhead lying between the eastern kerb-line of North Street (D2885) eastwards to the north-western channel line of Church Street (D2885) would remain unchanged as would the exemptions and exceptions from this part of the existing pedestrianisation scheme in High Street (D2885), Leatherhead.
 4. The purpose and effect of the proposed Order referred to in sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph 1 above would be to -
 - (a) alter the hours of when the existing Restricted Zone (a prohibition on the waiting by vehicles applying between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive) applies in that part of Church Street (D2885) which extends from a point opposite the northern building line of No. 2 High Street southwards for a distance of approximately 48 metres to the northernmost kerb-line of Church Street, Leatherhead and that part of High Street (D2885) Leatherhead which extends from the eastern kerb-line of North Street eastwards and then north-eastwards to the south-western kerb-line of the unnamed access road leading to and from The Leatherhead Institute to a prohibition on the waiting by vehicles applying between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day of the week;
 - (b) carry out certain drafting amendments to The Surrey County Council Church Street (D2885) and High Street (D2885) Leatherhead (Prohibition of Waiting) (Restricted Zone) Order 2017 (“the Order of 2017”) and The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in Mole Valley) (Residents’ On-Street Parking Places) Order 2017 (“the No. 1 Order of 2017”) which will not affect any of the measures introduced by either of those Orders.
 5. As indicated above, the existing one-way system applying to the lengths of High Street and Church Street, Leatherhead comprised within the existing pedestrianisation scheme referred to in sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph 2 above would remain unchanged, as would that part of the existing pedestrianisation scheme in High Street, Leatherhead referred to in paragraph 3 above. Additionally, the existing exemptions and exceptions

from the existing pedestrianisation scheme in Church Street and High Street, Leatherhead would remain unchanged (except as provided for in sub-paragraphs (c) (i) and (ii) of paragraph 2 above), as would all the existing exceptions and exemptions from the Restricted Zone referred to in sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph 4 above.

6. A copy of both of the proposed Orders, together with plans showing the lengths of roads to which those Orders relate, The Surrey County Council Church Street (B2033) and High Street (D2885) Leatherhead (Prohibition of Traffic and One-Way Traffic) Order 2003 (and the Orders which have previously amended that Order), the Order of 2017, the No. 1 Order of 2017, The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in Mole Valley) (Revocation and Consolidation of Waiting Loading and Unloading Prohibition and Restriction) Order 2017, The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in Mole Valley) (Consolidation of Free Street Parking Places and Loading Bays and Revocation) Order 2017, The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in Mole Valley) (Consolidation of Free Street Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) Order 2017, The Surrey County Council Minchin Close Leatherhead in the District of Mole Valley (Revocation and Consolidation of Waiting Restrictions and On-Street Parking Places) Order 2017, The Surrey County Council Kingston Road (D2887) Leatherhead (Prohibition of Waiting of Heavy Commercial Vehicles) Order 2017, The Surrey County Council Various Roads in Dorking Town Centre in the District of Mole Valley (Permit Zone) (On-Street Parking Place) Order 2017 and The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in Mole Valley) (Prohibition of Stopping Outside Schools) Order 2018 (and the Orders which have previously amended all of those Orders) (and the plans which accompany all of those sealed Orders), a Statement of the County Council's Reasons for proposing to make the Orders and a Statement of the County Council's Guidelines for the Acceptance of Objections to Traffic Regulation Orders may be inspected, free of charge -

- (a) at Leatherhead Library, The Mansion, Church Street, Leatherhead between 9.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Tuesdays to Saturdays inclusive; or
- (b) at Dorking Library, St Martin's Walk, Dorking on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays between 9.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m., on Tuesdays and Thursdays between 9.30 a.m. and 7 p.m. and on Saturdays between 9.30 a.m. and 5 p.m.; or
- (c) at Mole Valley District Council's Main Reception situated at the Administrative Centre, Pippbrook, Dorking during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive; or
- (d) by prior arrangement by telephoning or emailing the County Council's Merrow Complex, situated at Merrow Lane, Merrow, Guildford, Surrey, GU4 7BQ (Telephone No. 0300 200 1003 or Email: highways@surreycc.gov.uk) between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Thursdays inclusive and 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Fridays.
