## The Surrey County Council Meath Green Lane (D334) and Webber Street Horley (Prohibition of Turn and Entry and Revocation) Order 2022

On 3 May 2022 Surrey County Council made the above named Order, under Sections 1 and 2 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and all other enabling powers, which will come into force on 11 May 2022, the effect of which will be to impose the following vehicular restrictions other than for local buses - (1) prohibit a left or right turn from Meath Green Lane, Horley into Webber Street at its northernmost junction; (2) prohibit a left or right turn from Webber Street Horlev into Meath Green Lane at its northernmost junction; and (3) prohibit entry into Meath Green Lane, Horley into Webber Street at its southernmost junction and from the said Webber Street into Meath Green Lane. Such restrictions shall not apply to vehicles being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes in an emergency; or in relation to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform; or in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the road by or on behalf of Surrey Police. The Surrey County Council Webber Street Horley (Prohibition of Left and Right Turn) Order 2017 will be revoked in its entirety.

If you wish to question the validity of this Order or any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Act, or on grounds that any requirement of the Act, or any instrument made under it, has not been complied with, in relation to the Order, you may, within six weeks from the date of the making of the Order, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
