

**The Surrey County Council
Meath Green Lane (D334) Horley
(20 mph Speed Limit and Revocation) Order 2022**

On 3 May 2022 Surrey County Council made the above named Order, under Section 84 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) and all other enabling powers, which will come into force on 11 May 2022. The effect of the Order will be to extend the existing 20 mph speed limit in Meath Green Lane (D334) Horley, imposed by The Surrey County Council (Various Roads Reigate and Banstead) (20 mph Speed Limit) Order 2011, from a point 55m north of its junction with Landen Park to a point 930m in a generally north/easterly direction. The speed limit imposed by this Order shall not apply to vehicles used by special forces in accordance with the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011. That part of The Borough of Reigate and Banstead (Lonesome Lane (D334) (Part) and Meath Green Lane (D334) (Part) Horley) (Restricted Road and 40 mph Speed Limit) Order 1997 will be revoked in so far as it imposes a 40mph speed limit on part of the above length of road.
