## The Surrey County Council Mill Mead (D3282) Staines-Upon-Thames (Prohibition of Vehicles) Order 2021

On 23 November 2021 Surrey County Council made the above named Order under Sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act"), which will come into force on 27 November 2021. The effect of which will be to prohibit all vehicles from entering or proceeding in that length of Mill Mead (D3282) Staines-Upon-Thames, as extends from its junction with High Street to its junction with the new access road known as Furlong Road. Such prohibition will not apply in relation to: (1) Ambulance, fire brigade or police vehicles in an emergency; (2) Vehicles under the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, or of a sign placed pursuant to Sections 66 or 67 of the Act; (3) Pedal cycles; (4) Where necessary for the following operations: (a) Building industrial or demolition purposes; (b) The removal of any obstruction to traffic; (c) The maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road; (d) In connection with works on any sewer, gas, water, electricity or telecommunications system.

If you wish to question the validity of this Order or any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Act, or on grounds that any requirement of the act, or any instrument made under it, has not been complied with, in relation to the Order, you may, within six weeks from the date of the making of the Order, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
