## The Surrey County Council Various Roads in Oxshott (20 mph Speed Limit) Order 2023

On 7 February 2023 Surrey County Council made the above named Order, under Section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) and all other enabling powers, which will come into force on 13 February 2023. The effect of which will be to impose a 20 mph speed limit on the lengths of roads in Oxshott specified in the Schedule to this Notice. The speed limit imposed by this Order shall not apply to vehicles used by special forces in accordance with the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011.

**Schedule – (1)** A244 Leatherhead Road from a point 50 metres south of its junction with the centre line of Fernhill to its junction with High Street; (2) A244 High Street the entire length; (3) A244 Warren Lane from its junction with High Street to a point 75 metres north of its junction with the centre line of Steel's Lane; (4) D6862 Oakshade Road the entire length; (5) D6849 Fernhill the entire length; (6) D6862 Broomhall the entire length; (7) D6862 Silverdale Avenue the entire length.
