

Surrey County Council
Amendments to Waiting Restrictions
In Portsmouth Road and Fairmile Lane, Cobham

On 26 August 2020 Surrey County Council made The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in Elmbridge) (Waiting Loading and Unloading Restriction and On-Street Parking Places Orders) (Amendment No. 8) Order 2020, under Sections 1, 2, 4, 32, 35, 36, 45, 46, 49, 51, and 53 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 the Road Traffic and Regulation Act 1984 (“the Act”), which amends The Surrey County Council (Various Roads in Elmbridge) (Revocation and Consolidation of Waiting, Loading and Unloading Prohibition and Restriction) Order 2014, so as: -

- 1) Prohibit the waiting by vehicles at any time in both sides of Portsmouth Road, Cobham from its junction with Elvedon Road north-eastwards for a distance of 1,150m; and Fairmile Lane, Cobham, from its junction with Portsmouth Road to its junction with Queensgate;
- 2) Provide that the usual exemptions, for loading on and unloading from vehicles, boarding and alighting from vehicles, for works on or adjoining the said lengths of roads, the maintenance of those roads and the services in them and for disabled persons vehicles in accordance with the Blue Badge Scheme, would apply.
- 3) The London (Prohibition of Waiting) Clearways) Regulations 1963 (Amendment No. 1) Order 2020 is also made, which will revoke the existing clearway on the above length of Portsmouth Road.

Certain drafting amendments to the existing orders which impose waiting, loading and unloading and parking prohibitions and restrictions in the Borough of Elmbridge will be made, which will not affect the operation of those prohibitions and restrictions. Copies of the Orders, which will come into operation on 31 August 2020, together with plans showing the lengths of roads to which the Orders relate and a Statement of the Council’s reasons for making the Orders, may be viewed on-line at www.surreycc.gov.uk/roads-and-transport/policies-plans-consultations/roads-and-transport-consultations (follow the link to Portsmouth Road and Fairmile Lane, Cobham, prohibition of waiting proposal). If you are unable to access the webpage, copies can be obtained by contacting the Traffic Regulation Orders Team at the address below. If you wish to question the validity of the Orders, or any provision contained in them, on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Act, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act, or any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Orders, you may, within six weeks from the date of the making of the Orders, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
