The Surrey County Council Stroude Road (C10) Egham (30 Mph Speed Limit and Amendment) Order 2022

On 1 February 2022 Surrey County Council made the above named Order, under Section 84 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) and all other enabling powers, which will come into force on 7 February 2022. The effect of the Order will be to impose a 30 mph speed limit on that length of Stroude Road (C10), Egham as extends from lamp column N53 (near the junction with Whitehall Lane) in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 78.3 metres and amend The Urban District Council of Egham (40 mph Speed Limit) Order 1972, so as to revoke the 40 mph speed limit as applies from the existing terminal point of the 40 mph speed limit, 26 yards south-east of its junction with Whitehall Lane and Manorcrofts Road to a point 78.3m south-east of lamp column N53. The speed limit imposed by this Order shall not apply to vehicles used by special forces in accordance with the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011.
