Consultation Mandate draft v.1

Surrey Fire and Rescue Service (SFRS) is consulting on behalf of the Fire and Rescue Authority to understand the views of our communities who live, work, visit and travel through Surrey, businesses and local partner organisations; neighbouring fire and rescue services; and the workforce of SFRS, on the proposals for change that will impact on our communities outlined in the CRMP consultation document in response to the risk profile for Surrey.

The consultation is seeking feedback on the following issues:

- Whether the Community Risk Profile (CRP) has sufficiently identified the key fire and rescue risks facing Surrey;
- The proposal to close Banstead Fire Station and to relocate resources to Godstone Fire Station;
- The proposal to review our specialist vehicles and equipment locations to ensure they more closely match the fire and rescue risk profile of Surrey;
- The proposal to review of capability and resources at Camberley to ensure it more closely aligns to the current and future risk profile;
- The proposal to develop a response model which responds to fluctuating risk and season demand.
- The proposal to review the on-call weekend response model across Surrey to ensure it more appropriately meets the risk profile of Surrey;
- The proposal to review existing prevention, protection and response arrangements in Haslemere, to ensure it offers a more appropriate allocation of fire and rescue resources, ensuring 24/7 fire and rescue cover remains;
- The proposal to consider working more closely with health partners to allow Surrey Fire and Rescue to effectively respond to and support our most vulnerable residents.

This consultation will enable SFRS to consider feedback received and make any appropriate amendments to the proposals which will be included within the CRMP. This will then go to SFRS's Fire and Rescue Authority Cabinet Meeting for approval.

A report documenting the consultation results, will be provided alongside the draft CRMP document, which will have been informed throughout this consultation. This will be presented to SFRS's Fire and Rescue Authority at a Cabinet Meeting on 28 January 2025 for consideration and approval.

Subject to the approval, the 2025-2030 CRMP will take effect from 1 April 2025.
